## COVID SAFE – GENERAL RULES

We are currently operating under a range of Covid Safe Rules and we ask that everyone does their best to abide by these when at the Club and also as a member, help us to remind others to follow the basics to keep everyone safe.

We are working closely with Bay Thai to ensure both Bowling Club and Restaurant patrons are aware the rules.

## Inside the Clubrooms:

- Check-in using either the QR-Code or the book.
- Masks are to be worn unless seated.

- Food and drink are to be consumed at tables only.
- Abide by Patron limits.
- Maintain social distancing (if this is not possible a face mask must be worn).
- Regularly sanitise your hands.

#### On the Green:

- Check-in using either the QR-Code or the book.
- Equipment must be cleaned after use (cleaning liquid, cloths and hand sanitiser are available in the Tournament Room where the gear is stored).
- You should wear a face mask when physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained.

Please keep an eye out for signage which is regularly updated as rules and restrictions change.

#### BOARD OF MANAGEMENT UPDATE

The Board of Management continues to work hard towards the start of the coming season. A few items of interest from the recent meeting include:

- Bob Millichamp has accepted the vacant Assistant Secretary / Treasurer role on the Board. The appointment recognises the work and mentorship role Bob has continued to provide to the current Board.
- Significant work has been done on the maintenance front with focus primarily on the addressing plumbing and drainage throughout the premises and property. A couple of offending items removed from drains recently are pictured here – it's been a while since we served either of these products in the bar! Thank-you for the positive feedback in relation to the newsletter – time permitting we'll try to keep this as a monthly publication.


